

ALLITERATION

Alaric Alexander Watts (1797-1864), an English journalist and poet, wrote the poem, "The Siege of Belgrade," in which every line uses alliteration. All the words in line I begin with the letter A, in line 2 with the letter B, and so on through the entire alphabet. Apparently, Watts had trouble with the letter J, for that was the only letter he omitted.


ALLITERATION

Alliteration is the repetition of a sound in two or more neighboring words. It is the repeated use of an accented syllable that has the same beginning sound, as in "Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers"

Examples:

Alice ate an alligator.

Henry had a hank of hair.
